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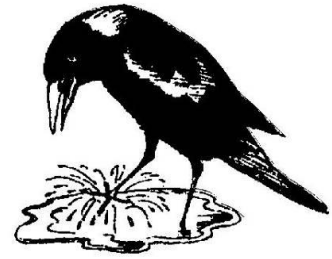

Wollumbin Think Tank Update

The Wollumbin Think Tank involves a group of twenty selected students from Murwillumbah Primary, Tyalgum, Dungay, Chillingham and Crystal Creek Public Schools visiting Wollumbin High school to broaden their learning experiences by asking environmental and ethical questions. This year, the Think Tank is a pilot project investigating services important to a community in crisis, deciding whether to rebuild or relocate, how infrastructure could be made more environmentally sustainable, accessing funds to rebuild and preventing future disasters through the topic, 'After the Flood'.

Gabi, Elizabeth, Jasmine, Jacob, Jacob and Seth are participating in this learning opportunity. In their words...

Jacob B: The six of us, along with kids from other schools are part of Think Tank. We go to Wollumbin High each Wednesday to learn about a topic called 'After the Flood'. On the first day we played a game to get know each other, then in groups, we built bridges from desk to desk.

Seth: The next day we went to the Clarrie Hall Dam to check the temperature, the ph and the salinity levels of the water. We found the ph level is 7.7 and the salinity is 0%.

Jacob I: We also get to make and edit videos. We made a video and it was 'Seth Grills'. It was funny because Jacob was a bear and Seth pretended to eat him. There was another video we made. It was 'Star Wars'. We all have great fun videoing.

Jasmine: Two weeks ago the Wollumbin Think Tank kids walked to the Murwillumbah Nursing Homes to interview the elderly people and to ask about their lives and the past floods that had happened throughout their lives. Of course, some of them did not live in Murwillumbah but that was okay because I could still learn about other towns or cities that have had floods before.

Gaby and Elizabeth: We participated in dam building at the Think Tank. That day, all we could use to build the wall was different types of rocks and things found in the garden. Some of us found pipes, tangles nests and plastic. The plastic was very useful because when we were trying to block the water, we put a plastic bag at the end of the pipe that was put in the wall to help make the spillway, but we had a change of plans.

Mid-Morning Snack - Reminder

Many of our students find waiting for the break at 11am can be too long, so we are encouraging parents to send along a nutritious mid-morning snack that can be eaten in the classroom without disrupting students' work. Suggestions are apples, bananas, carrot sticks, cherry tomatoes, cheese cubes or dried fruits.
