Principal's Message

I was very proud of all children who attended the Remembrance Day Services both in town and back at school last Monday.

Our school leaders led the service at the Cenotaph and did an outstanding job. They were a credit to our school!

The school choir were wonderful and sounded just fantastic as they always do. Our children from 3-6 are to be congratulated for the way they presented themselves throughout the service. Once again, their behaviour was excellent.

Children from K-2 also took part in a service conducted back at school. All staff informed me how well behaved they were during the service.

Congratulations to all our children. Thank you to the parents who were able to join us at either venue, your support was greatly appreciated.

State Government funding for public schools will be revamped from 2014. Working on the recommendations of the Gonski Review, schools will be funded based in part on their complexity.

To help measure this, information from school enrolments has been compiled to form a Family Occupation and Education Index (FOEI) score for each school. A score of 100 means that a school

is regarded as having students with "average" levels of educational advantage. Lower scores mean the school is relatively more advantaged and higher scores less advantaged – two thirds of schools score between 50 and 150.

Murwillumbah's score of 118 means we are well and truly in the middle. The good news is that with the additional funding agreed to before the Federal election, we will receive an extra \$120 000 next year. This will largely be spent directly on classroom teaching – great news.

Cedar Maycock of Year 4 travelled to Sydney on Thursday to receive a very special award. The award was part of the 'Write On' competition run by the NSW Board of Studies.

The competition was open to all students from NSW Public and Private Schools. Cedar was awarded a Gold Award for her short story titled 'Storm Boy'. It is on display in the front office and is an outstanding piece of Writing.

Our Annual Presentation Evening is scheduled to be held on Tuesday 10th December.
