LEARNING SUPPORT PROCEDURES

We are very lucky at MPS to have an experienced and pro-active Learning Support Team. This team consists of school executive, Learning and Support Teacher, School Counsellor and external providers where required. We are also in constant consultation with Learning and Wellbeing advisors as needed.

Process of Referral

1. Class Teacher is the first port of call for any emerging or identified concerns about your child's learning needs at school.
2. Class Teachers consult with their Stage team colleagues to collaborate on learning adjustments.
3. If needed, the Stage team may refer to the Learning Support team for further input.
4. The Learning Support team meet every second week to discuss referrals and provide advice to Stage teams.
5. One of the options the Learning Support Team may suggest is School Counsellor Referral. Please

note – appointments with the School Counsellor cannot be made directly by a parent. External Counsellors should be accessed if the family requires counselling services.

KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION

Next Friday the 8th November will be our last transition day for our children starting Kindergarten in 2020. We will be holding a meeting with our Kindergarten (2020) parents at 1.30pm in the Library. Valuable information will be presented at the meeting. An afternoon tea will be provided followed by a presentation of certificates to our transition children. We look forward to seeing all our transition parents at this meeting.

MATHS OLYMPIAD

Every year, schools from all over Australia, New Zealand and other neighbouring countries participate in the APSMO Maths Games and Maths Olympiad.

2019 was the first year that Murwillumbah Public School has entered the competition. The Maths Olympiad was used as an extension program for children that have a talent in the field of Mathematics. Children were nominated based on data gathered during our school assessment, NAPLAN results, classwork and teacher nominations.

Twice a week the selected 17 children were given an opportunity to work with a specialist teacher to refine their problem solving skills. They had 5 competition dates in which they had to answer a number of challenging questions. Australia and New Zealand wide, the marks were entered into a database and accumulated points. 2 of our children ranked in the top 20% and 4 others were in the top 25% of all entries. This is an extraordinary effort for the first exposure to such an illustrious competition.



2020 PLANNING

As we enter the final term for 2019, we are beginning to think about classing and staffing structures for 2020. To help with the organisation of class formations and planning for next year, could you please notify the school office as soon as possible if you know your child/children will not be attending MPS in 2020. We would really like to start the year with students in their 2020 classes. In order to do this it is important that we know if any students are leaving or enrolling in our school. If you have a special request for placement please let Mr Daley know by sending in a letter before the 25th November so this can be taken into account.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

It is important that students wear their correct uniform and a school hat each day when in the playground. We do follow Sun Safety Guidelines, meaning that if students are not wearing their hats then they will be required to play in the shade. Please support your child in remembering their hat each day and discuss sun safety with them. Please note that black socks are not part of the boys uniform. Grey socks should be worn by boys.

INFORMATION ON HOW TO APPLY FOR YEAR 7 ENTRY TO A SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL IN 2021

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2021 must be made online between 8 October 2019 and 11 November 2019. Late applications will not be accepted.

All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 12 March 2020.

Around the School with 3/4S & 3/4H

Term 4 is a busy and productive term for 3/4H and 3/4S.

In History we are studying the unit "First Contacts". This unit teaches us about life in Britain in the 1600's and 1700's, the early exploration of Australia (New Holland), the Indigenous people of Australia and the effects of early explorers and the First Fleet had on the Indigenous people.

In Science we are investigating matter. Students are participating in experiments which are helping them understand the concept that everything is made of matter and the different characteristics of matter known as the states of matter. These 3 states are solids, liquids and gases. Students are learning what causes matter to change from one state to another throughout concepts such as the water cycle.

Our successful Maths groups continue this term with concepts being covered including Whole Number, Patterns and Algebra, Time, Data (graphs) and Chance. The students are engaged in many interactive, games and hands-on activities in their groups.

All of Stage 2 has started rehearsing for our end of year Musical, "Lights! Camera! Action!" We can't wait for our performance at the end of November.

For Sport we have chosen sports we would like to learn skills in, and lucky for us 4 sports have professional coaches – Hockey, Netball, Rugby League and Soccer.

With the end of the year fast approaching Mr Stowe and I would like to thank all of the parents for your continued support this year. Thank you.

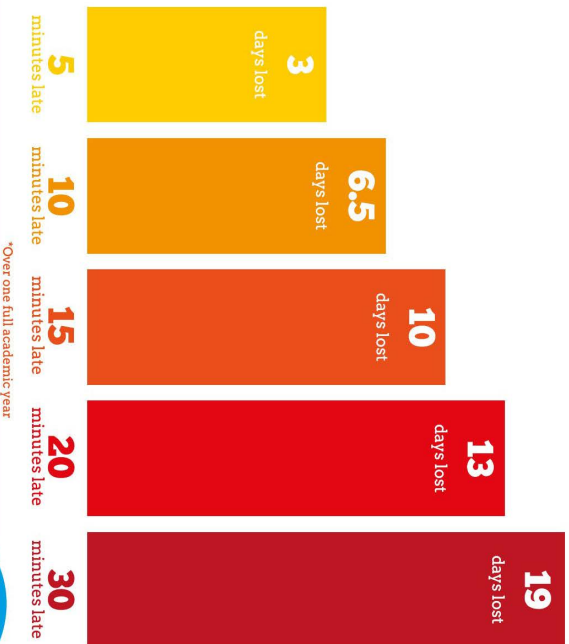


Halloween At The Canteen
