COVID Level 3 Restrictions

As we all enjoy the easing of some COVID restrictions across the state, it is important to note that NSW Department of Education Schools still remain on Level 3 restrictions. This involves a combination of layered safety measures allowing us to prioritise student and staff wellness while we keep schools open. These restrictions will most likely stay in place for the remainder of Term 4. However, the Department of Education continues to update the easing of some restrictions for certain activities as the term progresses. The school continues to monitor these announcements and act accordingly. It is important we follow these guidelines to ensure our school remains safe and open to avoid anymore interruptions to our students' education.

When picking up students early from school we ask that you try to give as much notice to the office staff as possible to allow them time to get your child from their classroom. When you arrive at the gate, please phone the office and

they will walk them up to the front gate.

They needed to solve a problem that was supplied to them. The problem was 'People have unlimited needs but the world has limited capacity to satisfy them'. They worked through a number of skill development workshops to develop their ideas and prepare for the competition. Our team pitched the idea to change how our school provides soy sauce in sushi lunches. The judges were amazed at how concise and simple our idea was. Although the students didn't make it through to the next round, the students had a fabulous day and developed many problem solving and collaboration skills.

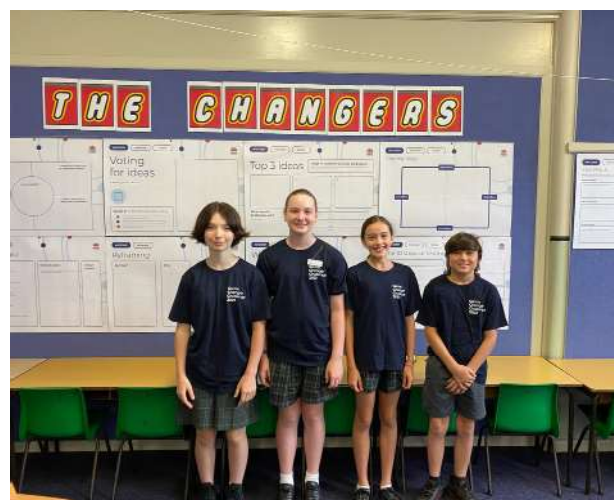
Check -In Assessment

The students in Years 3-6, have been participating in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment over the past fortnight. The check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning following the period of learning from home. The check-in assessments supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help

teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Mr Gamble has begun a new role within the school, since the beginning of the term. His new role of Curriculum Leader involves team teaching literacy and numeracy lesson with teachers across the school. The goal of these lessons is to improve student outcomes through the implementation of evidence-based teaching practices. As well as team teaching, Mr Gamble is responsible for leading and developing Professional Development sessions for the teachers at Murwillumbah Public School after school. These sessions have been centred around the improved teaching of comprehension for students across the school. The staff have worked alongside Mr Gamble to develop evidence-based teaching practices and programs to implement within the classroom, focusing on the different aspects of comprehension, such as inferencing, main idea, connecting ideas and audience and purpose. The engagement from students has been pleasing and has already resulted in improved comprehension results across the school.
